Four killed as ambulance crashes into bus

Four killed as ambulance crashes into bus

Osmanabad (Maharashtra), Feb 2 (IANS) An ambulance carrying the body of a 61-year-old man crashed into a bus, killing four more people, including the man's widow, a family friend and two drivers near **Vadgaon** early Thursday, police said.

The ambulance was going to Aurangabad when it rammed into a State Road Transport Corporation (ST) bus on the busy **Solapur-Osmanabad** highway. It was carrying the body of **Sarjerao Lokhande**, 61, of Aurangabad, who died while on a pilgrimage in Karnataka, an official of **Osmanabad police control room** said. Among the victims of the bus-ambulance crash were the widow of **Lokhande**, a family friend and two drivers of the ambulance. The drivers belonged to Karnataka, inspector **Anant Rathod** of **Osmanabad control room** said.

Besides, 11 people travelling on the **Osmanabad-Satara Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (ST) bus**, and four other passengers in the ill-fated ambulance were injured. 'All have been rushed to **Osmanabad district civil hospital** and the condition of one is reported to be critical,' **Rathod** told IANs.
