The Navratri celebrations are ON and on the day of culmination i.e. Navami, devotees will conclude their nine days of fast with **Kanya Pujan or Kanchak Pujan.** This is an age old tradition celebrated in the months of Chaitra (March) and Shardiya (Oct –Nov) Navratri. On this day, nine girls are worshiped representing the nine avatars of the Shakti, the Goddess Durga.

I wish to delve on the issue of it's significance in today's India.
